What is "AAA" Midget Hockey?

"AAA" Midget Hockey is the ultimate level in youth hockey. It is available to the players age 17 and under by birthdates determined by USA Hockey.

"AAA" Midget Hockey is the stepping stone to Junior "A" and College Hockey. The North American Junior Hockey League and the United States Hockey League are right now the primary sources for American hockey players used by College recruiters.

The "Fall Classic"

The Electricians will again host the "Annual Marquette Electricians Fall Classic" on the last weekend in September. This tournament has become one of the best Major Midget tournaments in the United States. Among the Tournament Champions have been both U.S. (Alaska All-Stars, Detroit Little Caesars) and Canadian (Thunder Bay Kings) National Champions.

Who are the Electricians?

The Electricians "AAA" Hockey Team was formed in 1986 to provide an opportunity for Upper Peninsula hockey players to compete at the highest level possible without having to travel too far from home. Although we are an Upper Peninsula based team, players from Lower Michigan, California, Pennsylvania, Wisconsin, Illinois, Indiana, Minnesota, Iowa, Texas, Missouri, Colorado, Utah, Arizona, Oklahoma, Alaska, Idaho, Canada, and Finland have called themselves Electricians

Housing

Non-Resident players are housed with families from the Marquette community. Often these are families from the local hockey program who volunteer to take in a student athlete for the hockey season. In keeping with NCAA regulations, room and board payments are charged.



Education

One of the major benefits of playing hockey for the Electricians is the fact that all players attend Marquette Senior High School. This is important especially to the non-resident players who can interact with their teammates in both education and social functions and not just see them at the rink. The Electricians require that a minimum 2.0 Grade Point Average be maintained to be eligible to play. Grades are monitored weekly by the coaching staff and by a member of the Board of Directors.

Quality of Life

The City of Marquette is located on the beautiful South shore of Lake Superior in Michigan's Upper Peninsula. It is accessible by air from Detroit and Minneapolis via Northwest Airlines, and from Chicago via American Airlines. By car we are 8 hours from Detroit, 7 hours from Minneapolis, and 6 hours from Chicago. Marquette and its surrounding townships have a population of about 30,000 and Northern Michigan University has an enrollment of about 8,500. Shopping Malls, movie theaters, golf courses and both downhill and cross-country ski facilities, along with events that surround a major State University, including Division I and II athletic events and a major Regional Medical Center, all within 10 minutes of each other make Marquette an ideal place to spend the hockey season.



Transportation

The Electricians own a 43 passenger motor coach that has been fitted with study tables, 3 televisions and a VCR. Seats have been removed and realigned to allow for maximum passenger comfort.

Staff

Since May 1, 2007 Scott Nevenhoven has been Head Coach for the Electricians, Nevenhoven, 33, a Marquette native, was most recently the Head Coach of the Ojibwa Eagles AAA Midget team in Houghton, where he compiled a record of 100-125-23 in four seasons. He also coached the Marquette American Legion Post #44 Bantam AA team for 4 seasons ('98-'02) where he was 143-52-41. He was Assistant Coach for the Marquette Redmen under Head Coach Mike L'Huillier for three seasons ('95-'98), and head Coach of the Marquette Jilbert Dairy Pee Wee AA for two seasons ('93-'95). Nevenhoven was also the recipient of Marquette Junior Hockey's Paul Berglund Memorial Award for Coach of the Year in 2000. Asst Coach Mike Dagenais, Dagenais, 23, was most recently the associate head coach of the Marquette American Legion Bantam AA team. Legion compiled a 49-19-3 record last season, with Brian Nebel as head coach. A Marquette native, Dagenais also served as an assistant coach for the RE/MAX Pee Wee AA team for the 2005-06 season and an assistant coach for the U.P. Sports Connection Squirt AA team for the 2004-05 campaign. A former Electrician, Dagenais was a Gold Medal winner for the United States Under 17 Select Team in the Four Nations Tournament in the Czech Republic, where Team USA was victorious over the Czech Republic, Germany, Canada and Sweden. He also played three seasons (2001-04) with the Waterloo Blackhawks Junior A team in the United States Hockey League.
